The CIF Nominating Committee met by a conference call and, Per Bylaw 70.E, nominated no less than seven individual candidates (see Federated Council Portfolio List) for a one-year term, to serve on the CIF Executive Committee. Additional nominations will also be accepted from the floor.

The Commissioners Committee is recommending a revision to Bylaw 503.F to better clarify when and how members of the coaching staff may be paid and reimbursed for coaching and teaching services.

With the passage of A.B. 2009 (Maienschein), the CIF must revise two Bylaws to reflect the changes in Education Code regarding Emergency Action Plans and A.E.D. for afterschool athletics.

e. Bylaw 2000.B-Varsity Football Age Requirement Medical Clearance

The CIF Sports Medicine Advisory Committee is recommending that Bylaw 2000.B-Varsity Football Age Requirement Medical Clearance be eliminated as there is no medical science data that supports the additional medical requirement. The committee also finds there is no established medical criteria for a medical practitioner to follow or rely upon.

Proposal to change Division Placement to year to year placements

This proposal would change Article 34 from its current form of doing Division placement every Two-Years to Year to Year. The new model would work as follows:

The new proposal would be for the following sports, Football, Volleyball, Tennis, Water Polo, Basketball, Soccer, Baseball and softball. (Bracketed Sports) Cross Country, Track & Field, wrestling, golf and swimming would be under the current format.

Upon completion of the last contest for each of the Bracketed sports the section office would place each of the teams entered in the play-offs into a division based upon their current year performance. This would be done by using play-off seeding criteria and any other data that would be pertinent to placing teams into the appropriate division. Appropriate division means where they are competitive, not too win a division title.

Examples of criteria to be used for placement:

Each of the criteria will be worth one point. The team with the most points gets the spot. If a criterion does not apply it will be excluded.

- Strength of schedule
- Head to Head Match-ups
- Maxpreps/Calpreps Rankings

Rationale for Change:

Teams would be placed in divisions using current year data and players. It would take away the feelings of being penalized for past success. It would also take into account transfers in and out of programs to determine appropriate placement and help ensure that teams are placed with

teams of common ability. Lastly teams that benefit from being into a lower division for multiple years will be placed appropriately with current results.

Football:

Using the above criteria teams would be placed in divisions as follows. 8-Teams in Divisions 1. The top 8 ranked teams will be in D1. All remaining Divisions would be 16-Team Brackets.

All other Bracketed Sports:

Division 1 would be eight teams and all other division a maximum of sixteen teams.

The Section office is proposing to go to Year to Year Division Placement. The placements would be done yearly using the most current two years Division Placement Points. Refer to Fall Division Placement for Sample.

- a. **Auto Times** that meet the above standards, up to 4.0 MPS on wind readings, will qualify to the CIF Area Meet. (Wind readings must be listed when submitted to Ron Blackwood and to the host of the Area Meets.)
- b. In Field Events, wind-aided marks up to 4.0 MPS will qualify to the Area Meet.
- c. Wind Gauges **must be used** to make a mark legal for a record or to be listed in the Valley top marks. (Records require a wind reading of 2.0 MPS or less.)
- d. Hand times may be used only if **three watches** are used to time first place.
- e. 1600m relay splits may not be used for 400m qualifying marks.
- f. There will be at least 18 athletes and relays per event at the Area Meets.

Note: #1 and #2 are special qualifying rules for the Area Meet. Wind legal marks (2.0MPS or less) must be submitted to qualify for all other meets during the season (e.g. West Coast Relays, Reedley Invitational etc.)
