Remove the following item:

(9) Schools with Cal-Pads Numbers over 1400 can not compete in Divisions lower than Division 3, and schools with Cal-Pads Numbers lower than 1250 can not advance more than 2 Divisions above their State Cal-Pads Division.

The Central Section Office shall determine the first day of practice in all sports. Sections, however, may not set as its first day of practice prior to:

(1) The Monday of the NFHS Calendar Week 5 for Fall Sports for 2014, Aug. 4; For 2015. Aug. 3
(2) The Monday of the NFHS Calendar Week 18 for Winter Sports. For 2014, Nov. 3; For 2015, Nov. 2 and
(3) The Monday of the NFHS Calendar Week 31 for Spring Sports. For 2014, Feb. 3; For 2015, Feb. 2

Note: These dates are inclusive of required/mandated dead days, such as Thanks Giving Day (Unless in Football Play-offs), Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Years Day and section mandated dead periods.

A. Last Contest Date

(1) The last contest date for regular season competition shall be determined by the Central Section Office.
(2) For sports culminating in Regional or State Championships, Section play-off competition must be Completed by the Saturday prior to the Regional or State Competition.

Note: The maximum number of allowable contests is in effect for both teams and individuals during the season. The maximum allowable contests do not include Section, Regional or State Championships.

C. Scrimmages

A scrimmage is defined as:

(1) An activity involving teams or individual student-athletes from two or more different schools in a CIF approved sport, and
(2) Where no Official score is kept, and
(3) Where no regulation time is kept, and
(4) Where no officials are paid, and
(5) Where substitute rules are set aside, and
(6) Where coaches may stop play for instructional purposes, and
(7) Where no score /results are released to the media.

Note: Each team is allowed one scrimmage per a sport, prior to the first interscholastic contest (league or non-league) of the season. Scrimmages shall not count in the teams or individuals maximum number of contests. Scrimmages held after a first interscholastic contest shall count as a contest.

Immediately following each schools completed season of sport, there will be a two week dead period with no contact between players and coaches of the just completed sports season. **Note: The use of outside agencies is not allowed to circumvent the "NO CONTACT PERIOD."**

PRE-SEASON

The only activities allowed during this time are non-sport specific conditioning and weight training, along with no use of specific equipment. During a Central Section **PRE-SEASON** period (preseason), no member of the coaching staff (paid or volunteer) may have contact with his/her athletes and use the sports equipment for their given sport. This includes high school coaches who are also club coaches and visa versa. **Note: The use of outside agencies is not allowed to circumvent the "NO CONTACT PERIOD."**

OFF-SEASON

Each of the three seasons will have a limited period during the school year, before or after the season of sport, in which schools may hold practices under the auspices of the school. Guidelines for limited periods are as follows:

OUTSIDE AGENCY

Activities must be sponsored by an agency not under the authority of CIF. If this option is chosen, the use of school equipment or funding is not permitted and any facility usage must be approved by the school district administration and the group must provide proof of insurance, and appropriate fees must be paid by the sponsoring organization.

Summer

The Central Section will be "Dark" Memorial week-end, until the first day of practice. Therefore, all activities during this time period shall be under the authority of each school district, with the exception of rules passed by the Board of Mangers. Does not include CIF State play-off sports still being conducted.

IX. e.

Tennis Advisory Proposal

1.0.0-A coach may coach a player at any time during the match so long as they do not interfere with play. Coaching MAY NOT take place while the ball is in play. Coaches are not allowed to pull players over to coach them during the 20 second break between points-players must remain on court during that time.

1.0.1-The purpose of coaching is to offer advice to their player or team. Coaches shall not in any way distract or talk to the opposing player.

1.0.2-Coaching is permitted outside the fence/court perimeter during the course of the match. If courts are inaccessible from outside the fence coaching may take place near the center post of the court provided that coaches do not distract the players on the court. Coaches may coach within the lines of the court only during changeover or set break. If a question about coaching arises it shall be settled by a meeting of both coaches.

1.0.3-A coach shall not initiate a conversation with the opposing player or in any way get involved with an on-court problem, except at the request, of the match referee, or the player, or the coach of the player involved. At no time should a player initiate a conversation with an opposing coach.

1.0.4-If a coach needs to be consulted due to a problem on the court, it is desirable for the opposing coach to be present.
